The golf carts are undergoing a thorough check and many of the other deficiencies are being dealt with. As this rebuild continues I will keep you in the loop.

I have heard from a few of you wondering about the graders being out and about, even without a recent snowfall. The reason for this is our Director of Public Works is trying to reduce the accumulation of snow before temperatures warm up. By doing so we are hoping to mitigate potential flooding. We think it's a good idea and we are definitely in support.

I know many of you are aware of some environmental issues that we inherited when we took office. I want to update you on these. We have had a longstanding drainage issue on the southwest end of town which your new Council is dealing with. We are working closely with the Ministry of Environment to

come up with both a short term solution as well as a long term plan to hopefully deal with this problem once and for all. It is definitely a work in progress and hopefully I will have more details for you in the near future.

Last year there were a couple of demolished buildings that were improperly disposed of. I cannot speak to why this decision was made, but I can say that we are currently working to make this right. We hope as the snow dissipates to rectify this issue and have the debris properly disposed of at a regulated site.

These were issues that you brought to my attention last year as I went door to door and these are issues that we are in the process of making right. As in our drainage issue we are working closely with the Ministry of Environment to make sure the problem is dealt with properly and permanently. Hope you find this information both interesting and helpful.

Are you planning a project in 2018?

Please note that from April to September is a busy time of year in Planning & Development. To ensure your construction can start on time, please make your application at least 2-4 months prior to planned construction date in order to maximize the construction season. Are you thinking of buying or selling property?

Compliance Certificates are typically requested when real estate is sold. A Compliance Certificate is confirmation from the Town of St. Paul that any existing development located on the subject property meets the regulations under the Land Use Bylaw. Application forms (and policy) can be obtained from the Town of St. Paul's website and must be submitted along with two original Real Property Reports prepared by a registered Alberta Land Surveyor. Please allow a minimum of 10 business days for processing. The fee for a Compliance Certificate is \$125.00.

TOWN OF ST. PAUL BORROWING BYLAW NO. 1244

Council for the Town of St. Paul has given first reading to Bylaw No. 1244, a bylaw authorizing the Town to incur indebtedness by the issuance of a debenture in the amount of \$5,624,000. Town Council of the Municipality has decided to issue Bylaw No. 1244 pursuant to Section 258 of the *Municipal Government Act* to authorize the financing, undertaking and completion of the St. Paul Wastewater Treatment Plan Upgrade.

Plans and specifications have been prepared and the total cost of the project is estimated to be \$11,128,000. The Municipality has been approved for a Canada Clean Water and Wastewater Fund grant in the amount of \$5,504,000 which will be applied to the project. All required approvals for the project will be obtained and the project will be in compliance with all *Acts* and *Regulations* of the Province of Alberta. In order to complete the project, it will be necessary for the Town of St. Paul to borrow the sum of \$5,624,000 for a period not exceeding 25 years, from the Alberta Capital Finance Authority or another authorized financial institution, by the issuance of debentures with an interest rate not to exceed 8%.

In accordance with Section 231 of the *Municipal Government Act* the electors of the Town of St. Paul may submit a petition for a vote of the electors to determine whether Bylaw No. 1244 should be passed. LOOSE GARBAGE = NOT PICKED UP

RESIDENTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO NOT EXCEED 3 BAGS OR 3 TRASH CANS PER HOUSEHOLD.

EACH BAG MUST NOT BE HEAVIER THAN 22.5 KG
