I want to start by addressing some concerns expressed by some citizens with regards to an organics collection program that this council put on hold at the beginning of the year. We have not scrapped this program. We are very aware that our community needs to invest in organics collection as well as recycling at some point. The reason we have slowed down the process is because we as a Council needed to understand the consequences of this program, (the price tag was in the millions) and in our humble opinion we did not feel there had been sufficient public engagement in this process. We were given a lot of conflicting information from a lot of different sources and even the main consultant behind this initiative recommended that we slow the process down until we had community buy in. In response to Council's many questions and our community's concerns we have formed the Citizen's Advisory Committee on Waste and Recycling. We will be looking for three members at large from within the Town that have waste and recycling experience and have the connections within our community to gather the feedback necessary to represent the community when making recommendations to council. We are excited about this direction and look forward to receiving applications.

By the time you read this our Canada Day celebrations will have taken place and despite the forecast we are hoping for good weather. On behalf of Council I would like to extend a heartfelt thank-you to Reeve Steve Upham and the County of St. Paul council for contributing half the cost of the fireworks display that I'm sure will have been a huge success. The County's contribution to our Canada Day festivities is an example of how both councils are making a concerted effort to work together for the benefit of all our citizens.

I also want to thank our ever supportive Fire Department for their involvement in Canada Day, ensuring this was a safe event. Their involvement in our communities is quite remarkable considering the majority are volunteers, and for the most part goes unrecognized, so a hearty "thanks" to all our fire department members for all you do for our community.

This past week I have had the pleasure of being involved in both the Indigenous Week celebrations and the Saddle Lake Pow Wow. I don't think there is any doubt these events were all an unqualified success with many existing relationships being strengthened and new relationships being made. It was my pleasure to be involved and I'm looking forward to next year.

Interested in keeping chickens in your backyard?



A development permit is required if you wish to keep chickens in your backyard. Chickens are only allowed on properties over 2 acres in size in the Urban Reserve District (UR). See page 191 to confirm which lands in the Town are zoned as UR in the Land Use Bylaw.
