

## Highlights from the Mayor



Summer has been questionable this year with cooler temperatures and rain most days, however I remind myself that we don't have to shovel rain and I'm not having to wear snow boots yet.

First a couple of housekeeping items I need to share. The route for the September long weekend parade will start with the assembly area on 53<sup>rd</sup> Ave., will begin heading south on 46<sup>th</sup> Street, then east on 50<sup>th</sup> for one block and then then south on 45<sup>th</sup> Street to 48<sup>th</sup> Ave. The complete route is detailed on the map below this letter. The route is being changed because of the construction on 42<sup>nd</sup> Street. We have had to coordinate our timing with the construction happening on the Co-Op and with all the rain both projects are running behind. Mother Nature is definitely not cooperating with us this year. Please pass on to family friends and neighbours that the route is changed and this year's route is detailed in the map below.

The second small issue is lack of corn for the beef on the bun dinner that the Town is holding on Saturday, August 31. With the decimation of the corn crop in Taber this year, we will not be able to offer corn on the cob. We will be offering heated canned corn in it's place. Hopefully next year will bring a healthy and tasty crop and we can get back to normal.

The last issue, I need to share with you is our project on 57<sup>th</sup> Street. We had planned to go ahead with this project this year, but the grant we have been waiting for has been held up with the Provincial budget not being announced until late October. Grant money can not be accessed if you start the project before it is awarded. If we go ahead now before we hear if the grant has been awarded, we will loose those funds and have to proceed with a scaled down project.

Council is equally frustrated as we know the residents in the area are, but a scaled back project likely wont meet anyone's expectations. Consequently, Council has voted to put off starting the project until first thing in the construction season next spring. We will know at that point whether we have been awarded the grant and whether we can proceed with the full scale project or not.

I am looking forward to Rodeo week, with the kick-off dinner on the Monday night culminating with the Rodeo on the long weekend. Though I'm praying for good weather, I'm sure the good people of St. Paul won't let a little rain stop them from having a good time.


